COVID-19 Vaccines Shown Effective in Children and Adults

- Kaiser Permanente is providing COVID-19 vaccines to people 6 months and older, now that the federal government has authorized vaccines for young children.
- Even as coronavirus infections surge in some parts of the country, COVID-19 vaccines play a big part in keeping rates of serious illness, hospitalizations and deaths fairly low and stable.
- Kaiser Permanente provides vaccines and boosters in all regions. We are also giving second boosters to certain members of the population who had their first booster at least 4 months ago. Learn how to get a vaccination or booster appointment at kp.org/covidvaccine.
- There are many people who still aren't vaccinated. Please continue taking precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19: wear masks, practice physical distancing in public, avoid crowded indoor spaces and wash hands frequently.



Vaccinations for Children and Teens

- The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has authorized emergency use of COVID-19 vaccines from Moderna and Pfizer/BioNTech for use in children ages 6 months of age and older.
- A parent or guardian must accompany anyone younger than 18 to their vaccine appointment. Medical staff may ask for the child's photo ID (such as a school ID card or passport) and proof of age before administering the vaccine.
